



From the parking lot on Fox Farm Hill Road, the *Bauneg Beg* trail leads through a deciduous forest to the top of the high peak, either gently through a pine grove – *Ginny's Way* – or more steeply through a large boulder section known as Devil's Den – *Linny's Way*. The hike up is a 20-30 minute walk.

North Peak, owned by the Town of North Berwick, can be reached by a loop off the main trail, connecting just below Devil's Den.

Tom's Way winds through beech forest between the middle peak and Bauneg Beg Mountain Road. There is no parking lot here, but you can pull off to the side of the road near the trailhead.

Trail work has mostly been done by a loyal cadre of local volunteers. In the spring of 2008 GWRLT expanded the trail network and with the Maine Conservation Corps, developed *Tom's Way* and *North Peak Loop*. Funding was generously provided by Kennebunk Savings.

Trail Use

Bauneg Beg Mountain Conservation Area

- Properties are open from dawn to dusk.
- Prohibited uses: motorized vehicles, overnight camping or fires. Our neighbors and the Trust do not want to put these fragile areas at risk!
- Carry out what you bring in.
- Respect the properties. Stay on the marked trails and stay off the trails that have been closed.
- Respect the boundaries of our neighbors' properties.
- Take lots of pictures, but don't pick the plants or handle the animals.
- Enjoy the views and the sounds of nature. If we treat the land well, we will be able to enjoy it for generations.
- Ticks are present. Wear sensible clothing, repellent, and check yourself carefully when exiting the land.

In the northern tip of North Berwick lies Bauneg Beg Mountain Conservation Area, consisting of 89 wooded acres of peaceful trails, surprising rock formations, and a panoramic view. Bauneg Beg is an elusive mountain, seen only from a distance and in certain weather conditions. It seems to hide from those who approach, and hikers rarely expect the awesome rock formations and panoramic view they find at the top. It has a few steep steps at the top, but is otherwise very manageable for just about anyone. This is an excellent family hiking spot in all seasons.

Bauneg Beg Mountain has three peaks, the highest of which is 866' – higher than Mt. Agamenticus. The peaks can be seen from the Atlantic Ocean and have been used by mariners navigating the Maine Coast. On a clear day, from the top, you can see both Mount Washington to the NW and the Atlantic Ocean to the SE. The mountain is the only one in southern Maine that does not have a radio tower.

Great Works permanently conserved this property in 2001 with the dedicated help of many friends and neighbors of Bauneg Beg.

Directions to Fox Farm Hill Road parking lot and trailhead:

Heading north on Rte. 4 out of North Berwick, go 2.1 miles, then left on Boyle Road, continue straight as it turns into Ford Quint Road, about 5.5 miles, then left on Fox Farm Hill Road. Parking lot will be about .3 miles on left.

For an enjoyable loop back to North Berwick, continue on Fox Farm Hill Road, left on Hammond Road, left on Bauneg Beg Hill Road, left on Oak Woods Road, taking you to Route 4, then right on into North Berwick.
